Shoreline shell surveys

Nurdle Surveys

Nurdles are plastic pellets used to make a wide range of plastic items. When nurdles get into waterways, they resemble floating fish eggs and wildlife mistakenly eat them with devastating results. Help us collect nurdles so we can track and stop their source.
